Must Catholic Weddings Always Take Place In Church? If So, Why?

The wedding season is here and many engaged couples are looking for a location that will easily accommodate both the ceremony and their reception. Its' either that or they want their wedding to be remembered for its "surroundings" which spurs them on to plan a "destination wedding." Because most church weddings don't meet the muster of convenience or create a memorable backdrop, the idea of a church wedding is being questioned by many couples.

The real reason for a "church wedding" is to celebrate a solemn Sacrament. Since marriage is a Sacrament, the Catholic Church asks that it be celebrated within a sacred place - a church. That is why we celebrate weddings in the same building that we celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion and Reconciliation.



Priests usually end up explaining to couples that the Catholic Church expects that a wedding, being a solemn and sacramental event, should occur in a church—in sacred space. Usually that's something that they understand, and it's not a problem. But occasionally they hear, 'Well, isn't God present everywhere?' The proper response would be 'Yes, God is just as present at the Marathon station on Hwy 12, but you don't want to get married there, do you?'"

Stop and think about this: stepping into a church is very different from stepping into any other building

or location, however beautiful. By its very nature, a church is meant to be a place of reverence, awe, and peace. It is meant to welcome all persons into the loving presence of God; the Creator of love and life. In fact, within a Catholic Church, Jesus is literally present in the tabernacle! A church is not just an environment that can be "themed" or a location that will produce great pictures. It is a sacred place for sacred promises; like the promise to be faithful to each other and married forever.

To some people, this might sound like legalism, and it can be frustrating to couples who want to design their own wedding experience. But the Catholic Church is trying to teach us what God's plan for marriage is. This is especially important when our culture attempts to equate an over-the-top wedding extravaganza with a successful life-long marriage.

A truly happy marriage happens when a couple understands that God's presence within their relationship and the family they hope to have, is far greater and more important than the sentiments of their wedding day. Unfortunately, today's culture views weddings as romantic events and its enough if brides and grooms just "keep the religious stuff in mind." The Sacrament of Matrimony needs to be central to the wedding, so God will be central to the marriage. That's why the Catholic Church celebrates weddings in a church.

Thank God—literally—that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is—and remember the thanks we owe the Giver.
