**Right now, the abortion industry and their friends in the legislature are trying hard to repeal the Parental Notification Act in Illinois.** This commonsense law requires only that a parent be notified 48 hours before an abortion clinic performs an abortion on their daughter.

This law provides foundational protection for girls by providing them with a support network and protecting them from sexual traffickers. Since the law was put in place, over 1,000 unborn babies have been saved each year in Illinois because of it.
