





Our Lady of Fatima Shrine

Recently, several parishioners have asked Fr. Joe to consider getting new statues for the Shrine of Our Lady of Fatima. The statues we currently have are made of cement and are the originals. They had been repainted several times, but now they have an earthy, rust colored stain and a fungus that is a far cry from being called a 'patina'!

Fr. Joe asked a professional for advice and was told that all the cracks would make power-washing or sandblasting prohibitive. Should the cleaning be done by hand, it would be costly and the cracks would still not be fixed.

Six new statues (Our Lady, the 3 children and two lambs) would be made by the Demetz Art Studio in Italy. They would be very similar to the grouping we currently have, but made of outdoor fiberglass instead.

WHAT DO CATHOLICS BELIEVE ABOUT THE **RESURRECTION OF THE DEAD?**

Every Sunday, we proclaim in the Creed that we believe "in the resurrection of the body." Does that mean Christ's Resurrection or our own? Both! Jesus' Resurrection is part of the work of salvation, but it's also a sign of what's to come. While death separates our bodies and our souls, this was not the intention of God when He first created us. It's an effect of Original Sin. At the end of time, our bodies and our souls will be reunited.

Scientifically, we may have questions about this, since bodies decompose over the course of centuries. Or what about the saints, whose relics are spread around the earth? How the resurrection will happen is a mystery. But we know that our resurrected body will be our body. If we are in heaven, our body will be in a glorified state. Some theologians speculate what glorification will be like based on Jesus' resurrected body. Will we be able to walk through walls? Will we eat, since Jesus broke bread with His disciples? We don't really know the answers to these questions. We do know, however, that we will be free from the effects of the fall (such as sickness and pain) and physical defects that occurred in life. Christ redeems us as whole persons, body and soul!


