#### **The Advent Wreath Tradition & Meaning**

One of the many ways that Christians celebrate the month of December leading up to Christmas Day is the Advent Wreath. Although Advent Wreaths are popular, many Christians are not aware of the rich meaning and symbolism embedded in this tradition. Maybe if we learn a little more about its meaning, we can appreciate it all the more!

#### **Darkness And Light**

Advent candles demonstrate a strong contrast between darkness and light, which

is an important biblical image. Jesus referred to Himself as the "Light of the World" that dispels the darkness of sin: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). Human history has spanned long ages shrouded in the darkness of sin before our prophesied Savior would finally make His appearance to free us from its dominion. As the Messiah's "coming" or "Advent" draws near, another candle is lit, with each candle dispels the darkness a little more. The Advent Wreath is a symbol that helps us spiritually contemplate our Salvation History that surrounds the birth of Emanuel, God Incarnate who comes to redeem the human race and make all things new (Revelation 21:5).

Most importantly, it reminds us that as Christians, we're meant to shine the light of Christ in this world! You are the light of the world... let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in Heaven (Matthew 5:14-16).

**Shape:** The circular shape of the wreath, without beginning or end, symbolizes God's complete and unending love for us—a love that sent His Son into the world to redeem us from the curse of sin. *It also represents eternal life which becomes ours through faith and works in Jesus Christ.* 

**Number:** One tradition held that the Advent Wreath traditionally holds four candles which are lit, one at a time, on each of the four Sundays of the Advent Season. Each candle represents 1,000 years. Added together, the four candles symbolize the 4,000 years that humanity waited for the world's Savior—from Adam and Eve to Jesus, whose birth was foretold in the Old Testament.

**Color:** Violet is a liturgical color that is used to signify a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice and is used during Advent and Lent. Advent, also called *"little Lent,"* is the season where we spiritually wait in our *"darkness"* with hopeful expectation for our promised redemption, just as the whole world did before Christ's birth, and just as the whole world does now as we eagerly await His promised return.

#### The Four Weeks of Advent

During the first two weeks of Advent we light the first two purple candles. The Third Sunday of Advent is called Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. On this day we celebrate that our waiting for the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day is almost over. Rose is a liturgical color that is used to signify joy, so we light the single pink candle on the third Sunday of Advent.

Then on the fourth Sunday of Advent, the final purple candle is lit to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait expectantly for the soon-coming birth of the King of Kings. *The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding Our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.* 

- ◆ The 1st Sunday of Advent *symbolizes <u>Hope</u>* with the "Prophet's Candle" reminding us that Jesus is coming.
- ◆ The 2nd Sunday of Advent *symbolizes <u>Faith</u>* with the "Bethlehem Candle" reminding us of Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- ◆ The 3rd Sunday of Advent **symbolizes Joy** with the "Shepherd Candle" reminding us of the Joy the world experienced at the coming birth of Jesus.
- ◆ The 4th Sunday of Advent *symbolizes <u>Peace</u>* with the "Angel's Candle" reminding us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

The Advent Wreath serves as a powerful visual reminder of the holiness of the season. The light of the candles invite us to quiet ourselves during this busy time and reflect on the true meaning of Christmas. Whether at home or at Church, it provides an invitation to wait and pray in hopeful anticipation for the coming of Christ. We are all called to welcome the light of Christ into our lives.

#### Preparing the Manger

Where do you fall in the "Christmas-songs-in-November" debate; do you like them, tolerate them, or outright hate them? There's no theological problem with Christmas songs in November outside of worship, even if it's not everyone's cup of tea. But there is a problem with getting so caught up in the baggage of the season—the trimmings, the gifts, the celebrations, all of which are marvelous in their own way—that you forget to prepare the manger.

Every good Catholic knows that Lent is a penitential season. It's hard to miss that point—Lent doesn't even have any fun songs you can groove to on the radio. We are pretty good at recognizing that Lent calls us to examine ourselves. To deny ourselves. To give of ourselves. And most of all, Lent calls us to prepare, as a good steward does, for the return of our master.

It's harder for us to remember that with Advent, but Advent is just as much of an opportunity for penance, preparation, and reconciliation to God—and just as much reason too. The very name of the season "Advent" encourages us to focus on what is coming, not what is already here. Be on guard, the readings tell us today, "so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and (the coming of the Lord) catch you unexpectedly like a trap."

So let us not forget—our master's advent is upon us. And let us ask ourselves: how can we prepare the manger?

One Christmas, a mother asked her young daughter if she could name two of Santa's reindeer.


"Rudolph and Olive," replied the young girl confidently.
