
LIVE THE LITURGY

The Epiphany is early this year, falling right on the heels of New Year's Day. *If we haven't made our New Year's resolutions yet, now is a good time to do so.* In addition to typical resolutions such as reducing clutter or getting fit, we can set some spiritual goals as well.

The definition of epiphany (lower case) is

"a moment in which you suddenly see or understand

something in a new or very clear way." As we reflect on today's readings, let us ask the Holy Spirit to provide us an epiphany - into how we can grow closer to Jesus during this year ahead. Just as their



encounter with the infant Jesus caused the Magi to be transformed from outsiders to faithful believers, and to take a different route home, our encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist is meant to transform all of us, and set us on a new path to light and life.

The Blessing of the Home on the Feast of the Epiphany

This blessing is generally done by the head of the household with the family together with Chalk Blessed at the Epiphany Liturgy.

With the Blessed Chalk write the following inscription above the entryway door to your home. The letters C, M, B have a double meaning. They are the initials of the wise men. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase Christus Mansionem Benedicat which means, "May Christ Bless the House." The + sign represents the cross and the numbers the current year.

Use the Blessed Chalk to inscribe above your door as follows: 20 + C + M + B + 22 While saying:

The three wise men, Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's Son who became man two thousand and twenty-one years ago. May Jesus Bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen.

Let us Pray.

O Blessed Lord, visit our home with gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; and grant that we may manifest your love to each other and to all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you. Guide, comfort, and strengthen us in your peace. We ask this in the name of Jesus. Amen.

Sprinkle holy water throughout your home.
