

### LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

*Everyone wants to experience peace.* When we look to the world to provide this for us, we can easily get disappointed. ### Fifteen Promises Granted to Those Who Pray the Rosary Given by Our Lady to St. Dominic

- 1) Whoever shall faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall receive signal graces.
- 2) I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- 3) The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell, it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4) The Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish; it will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire for eternal things. Oh, that souls would sanctify themselves by this means.
- 5) The soul which recommends itself to me by the recitation of the Rosary, shall not perish.
- 6) Whoever shall recite the Rosary devoutly, applying himself to the consideration of its sacred mysteries shall never be conquered by misfortune. God will not chastise him in His justice, he shall not perish by an unprovided death; if he be just he shall remain in the grace of God, and become worthy of eternal life.
- 7) Whoever shall have a true devotion for the Rosary shall not die without the sacraments of the Church.
- 8) Those who are faithful to recite the Rosary shall have during their life and at their death, the light of God and the plentitude of His graces; at the moment of death they shall participate in the merits of the saints in paradise.
- 9) I shall deliver from Purgatory those who have been devoted to the Rosary.
- 10) The faithful children of the Rosary shall merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.
- 11) You shall obtain all you ask of me by the recitation of the Rosary.
- 12) All those who propagate the Holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- 13) I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of death.
- 14) All who recite the Rosary are my sons and daughters, and brothers and sisters of my only Son Jesus Christ.
- 15) Devotion of my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

*I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?* 

#### Answer:

You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and leave for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange. He was asked to believe—on the word of an angelic appearance in a dream -that his betrothed was pregnant not from another man, but by a miraculous intervention of God. Then he was called to marry her. Author Flannery O'Connor once wrote, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you odd." Sometimes God's invitation might seem strange or challenging. It might require sacrifices we never expected to make. Our life might look different than we had always imagined. But as we all know, life throws its own curveballs, regardless of whether or not we're listening for God's will. Better, one would think, to be open to the promptings of God and to follow along the strange trails that they lead. We have the assurance that, eventually, we will find green pastures.


