Bad news is flooding our minds from every direction, whether it be the destruction wrought by Hurricane Ian or inflation that is out of control. Crime is rising everywhere and we're told to expect a resurgence of the COVID virus this winter. Some world leaders act like they lost their minds and we have politicians who forgot the lies they told yesterday. Fentanyl flows across our open southern border, but now its candy coated, just in time for Halloween. Who can deny that the threats we face at home and abroad seem to be reaching new heights? And in the midst of all the bad news, the natural reaction is to become anxious, depressed and afraid. But as I recently read my morning prayers, there was a particular line, in the Book of Psalms, that resonated within me. In it, the author challenges us to not fall into the trap that bad news sets for us. Instead, we're told to follow the example of people who are righteous:

## He is not afraid of bad news: his heart is firm, trusting in the Lord. (Ps 112:7)

Notice that God isn't saying that righteous people will never receive bad news. The fact is, they do. Afterall, that's life in this valley of tears! But scripture teaches that people who are truly righteous will not be afraid. It's very similar to what John Paul II frequently taught us during his papacy: *"Do not be afraid,"* the Holy Father said!

His were the same words Christ often spoke throughout the New Testament, and hardly does a day go by when that same divine challenge isn't made to us. But when will we listen to it?

Did you ever wonder why righteous people aren't afraid? It's not that the bad news isn't so bad. The answer lies in their hearts: because *"their heart is firm."* And the psalmist makes sure he gets his point across by repeating himself in the very next verse: *"His heart is steady; he will not be afraid" (Psalm 112:8).* Realize that bad news will always test our hearts.

When bad news reaches our ears, we can even feel our hearts beat faster! But what makes our heart firm and steady? Faith in God! *"Trusting in the Lord"* is what anchors our hearts and keeps them from being carried away by the storms of fear and anxiety. We must not forget that in order to have a strong heart, we need strong faith, and strong faith is needed now more than ever.
