MIDTERM ELECTION 2022

he countdown has already started and come this Tuesday, Nov. 8th, it will be Midterm Election Day when we will be exercising our privilege and duty as American citizens to vote. Few elections, in American history, will be as important as this one, and it's good to remember that for us Catholics, voting is a moral obligation and participating in the whole process is a virtue!

We all know there are major differences between candidates, but if we feel that one candidate is just as bad as the other, we must never allow that feeling to become the reason for us to lose interest and decide to stay home on November 8th. What we need to do is study and learn the positions of the people whose names appear on that ballot! Don't just listen to what they say because politicians say all sorts of things depending on what day it is. Instead, study their voting records and look what they've actually done to highlight the differences, because you can bet that one candidate will always be closer to our values and viewpoints than the other.

Also, let your guidance be the difference between certainty and doubt. More often than not, we're faced with the choice between a candidate we know we don't want and someone else about whom we're not sure. But the point is, you don't have to be certain about how every choice or action of your candidate is going to turn out. It they lean in the right direction or if there is the probability or possibility that they will do the right thing and make the right choices, that is much better than the certainty of a candidate who will make the wrong choices. So... when faced with the choice between a certain evil and a possible good, choose the possible good.

Last bit of advice is this. Don't vote to just make yourself feel good. Our votes are meant to influence our American

society in the right direction by helping us get people into public office who will help make that happen. So remember that your vote is not an opinion poll about what we think about a candidate. It's actually a transfer of power, but it's also a gamble. It's a gamble because God doesn't always give us clear, predicable choices. But He does expect us to use good judgment, and its good judgments that help us avoid evils that are certain, and increase the possibilities for good.

If you haven't participated in early voting yet, make sure you don't skip the election on Tuesday! Everyone needs to vote! And vote as if everything we dream for our children and value as Americans, and the ways we practice our faith depends on it.

Their names have been inscribed in our Book of Remembrance, lovingly placed in front of the ambo where it will remain throughout the month of November. You will notice a rosemary plant just to the right of the book. Many of us use rosemary when we cook because it is a wonderful, aromatic herb. But did you know that, for many centuries, it was also associated with death and remembrance? It's true! In fact, as part of the burial rite, mourners would toss bouquets of rosemary on top of their loved one's casket!

To the left of the Book of Remembrance is a small Olive Tree. In ancient times, olive oil was used as fuel, in lamps, to give light, It was also a symbol of peace and where the expression of "extending an olive branch" originated. These are visible reminders, for us to pray, that our deceased loved ones be resting in light and peace,

May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy and love of God, rest in peace.

Cemetery News!


I wanted to share a few updates with you regarding our cemetery...


