





Improve your Health: Give Thanks!



Study after study proves that being grateful improves our overall health; especially our mental health. This Thanksgiving (and beyond) try to incorporate some of these practices into your life.

- Write a thank you note... send it or better yet deliver it and read it aloud to the person.
- **Do an experiment...** do as many small acts of kindness (open the door, smile, say have a great day, etc.) for people and count how many "thank you's" you get in a day.

Try to break your record tomorrow!

- **Keep a gratitude journal...** each day write down the things, the people, the actions, the gifts from God for which you are thankful. The more you do this, you may find you want less.
- **Pray...** try spending more time in thankful prayer rather than supplication prayer.
- Meditate... focus on the present moment and be grateful for whatever your senses take in, the air you breathe, the warmth of the sun on your face, in this very moment, give thanks!
- Keep a gratitude jar... every time you are thankful
 for someone or something, jot it down and place it
 in the jar, at the end of the week, lift the jar up in
 thanksgiving to the Lord for bringing each of these
 wonderful people or things into your life.
- Count your blessings... ask someone (preferably a child) to give you a number between 1-? And then as quickly as possible say the things for which you are grateful, trying to reach that number (have the child time you, to add to the fun).
