


On Sunday, February 5th our First Communicants will be picking Prayer Pals and giving them a loaf of bread along with a Prayer Pal card.

What exactly is a "Prayer Pal?"

A "Prayer Pal" is a parishioner who promises to pray for a child and their family during the child's sacramental year, while the child and their family pray for their parishioner. If you are selected as a Prayer Pal, you will be given a loaf of



bread symbolizing the Eucharist. When a parishioner accepts the bread and the card, the hope is that they will form a spiritual bond with the First Communicant from now through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Once this bond begins, allow the movements of the Holy Spirit to draw you closer in prayer and presence with your Prayer Pal.

The "Eucharist is a Mystery to Live"

Our late Holy Father Benedict XVI passionately spoke on how the Eucharist needs to be lived to the full. "The worship of God in our lives cannot be relegated to something private and individual, but tends by its nature to permeate every aspect of our existence." (Sacramentum Caritatis, no. 71)

The problem with the modern age Benedict XVI stated isn't the disbelief in God but the gap between faith and life, manifest in so many believers. *They go to Mass on Sunday, yet they live the rest of their lives as if God does not exist. This is what Benedict XVI referred to as practical atheism.*

Living the Eucharistic mystery necessitates that I attune my life to this mystery of love. I must testify in public spaces that I believe in this God who is love. I must live this out through works of mercy, feeding the hungry and giving drink to the thirsty, visiting the prisoner and welcoming the stranger. In the political sphere, I must advocate for policies that are consistent with the Eucharistic mystery, where the God-man comes to dwell among us poor mortals. I must let my reception of the Eucharist shape my life so that I am a coherent witness to the very God who is love.

You (and I) can start living this by becoming someone who reflects this mystery of love in your own neighborhood and workplaces. All it takes is deeper appreciation of the gift of love that you receive in every Mass. All it takes is pausing for a moment before the tabernacle, giving thanks that God loves you enough to be so close to you. *All it takes is letting that worship shape how you live as a Christian in the public sphere, witnessing to the gratuity of the God who is love, who loves us unto the end.*

For Reflection: Think about your day-to-day life. Is there a way that you might better connect your daily experiences and choices to your participation in the Eucharist? If so, what might it look like?



Sanctuary Course for Catholics

Would you value joining others in a conversation about mental health?

Would you like to discover what God, Scripture, and Church have to say in light of the experiences of mental health challenges? The subject matter feels particularly relevant in these times of heightened anxiety, and the course creates an opportunity to connect with and support each other in meaningful ways.

About the Course:

The Sanctuary Course for Catholics is an eightpart course for small groups designed to raise awareness and start conversations in local parishes regarding mental health. It was created in collaboration with Catholic mental health professionals, theologians, and clergy, and offers faith communities the opportunity to learn about mental health and grow in their ability to support members living with mental health challenges.

Topics covered include: mental health and mental illness, stigma, recovery, companionship, self-care, and community. The sessions are accompanied by compelling films that feature the stories of Catholics living with mental health challenges, along with the insight of archbishops, theologians, and psychologists.

Catholic Charities invites you to join them in viewing and discussing the Sanctuary Course for Catholics. We will view the films together followed by group discussion.

There is no homework and no cost to attend.

Course is appropriate for all adults. begins Wednesday, March 1 from 7:00 - 8:30 pm for 8 consecutive weeks, skipping Holy Week, using Microsoft Teams online.
