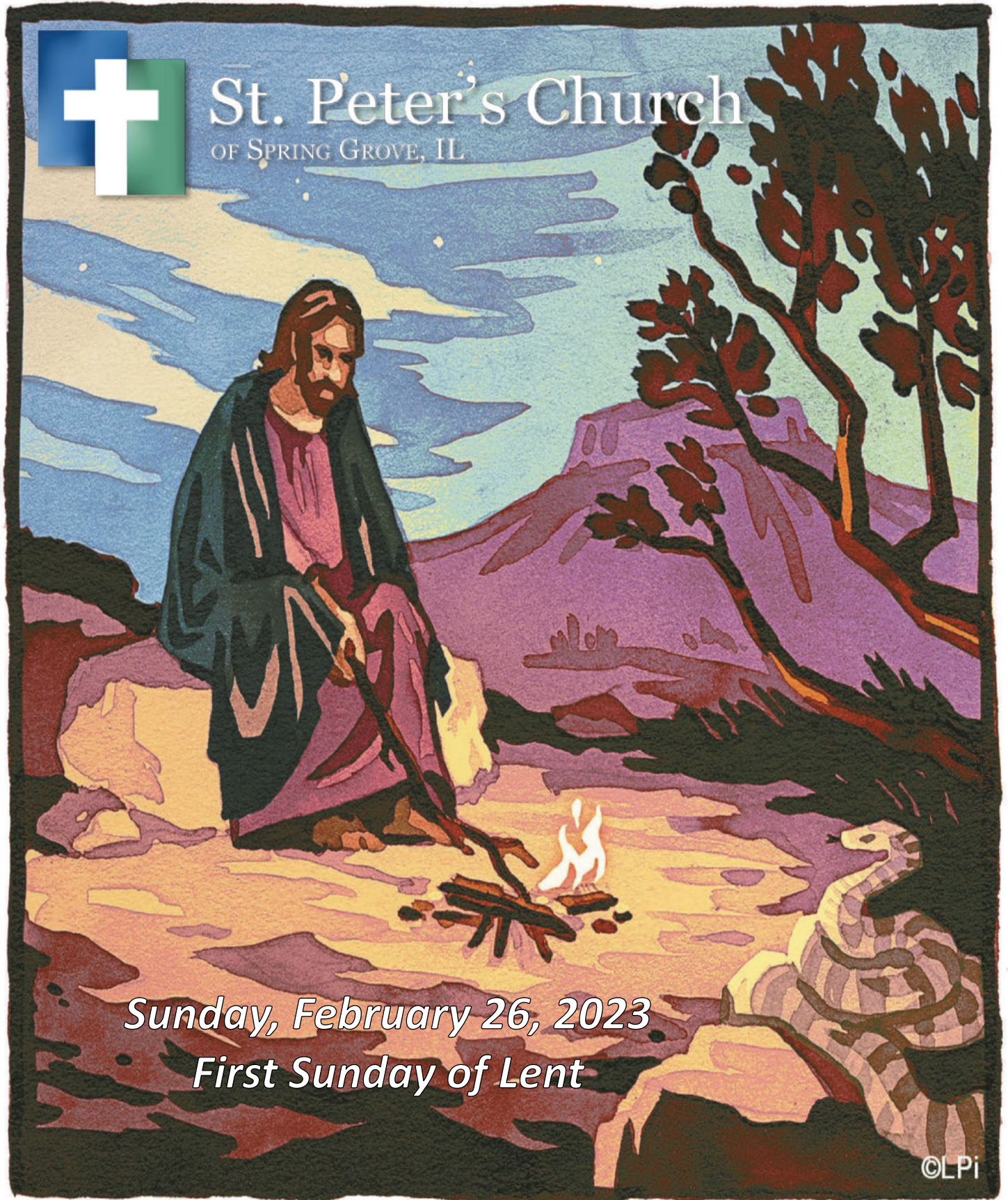

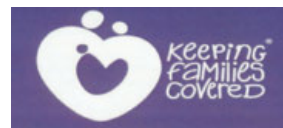

The people in Umon-Okon, Nigeria, where Fr. Akan Simon was born and raised, are hungry. Even basic food, like bread is hard to come by these days. Bread is a staple food for the people in the village and they eat it in many ways. For breakfast, they combine peanuts or bananas with the bread. It is their lunch and dinner, too! Mothers will even mash bread in warm water to make baby formula!

On May 16th, Fr. Simon will be celebrating his 25th anniversary of ordination. He wants only one thing to commemorate this milestone in his life; he wants to build a bakery for the villagers! It will be called *Divine Bakery*, and bread for charity will be a major component of the business model. First Sunday of Lent Reflection

Superbowl Sunday was two weeks ago, and many of us were more likely interested in the commercials than the actual game. After all, companies pay a ton of money to have their products paraded in front of us, and—in theory at least—take the time to make these particular ads memorable and funny. If we can be convinced that we will be better people, or our **social sufferings greater and filled with more laughter**, we will buy what they are selling. It's the modern version of the words of the serpent in today's first reading: If you eat this, "you will be like gods!" Today's readings are a reminder that we are all sinners and burdened by being vulnerable to false promises—but also that we are relieved of this burden through one man: Jesus Christ. If we tend to forget that the most important part of our salvation story is that it is full of more grace and forgiveness than we can comprehend, this first Sunday of Lent is a good time to prayerfully ponder this. If God seems far away or distant, let us recall that He loved us so much that He breathed our very life into us, and then gave His only begotten Son to us that we might have life eternally. All He asks in return is for us to accept this gift and follow in His footsteps. Lent is the time to be mindful of grace-filled opportunities that draw us closer to God.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

Formed and Fallen

There is a version of myself that walks into church on Ash Wednesday and a version of myself that walks into church on Good Friday. Aside from having the same face, these women bear very little resemblance to one another.

Ash Wednesday Me is fired up. She's ready to go. She's got a stomach full of pączki, a forehead full of ashes, an oven full of fasting bread and a whole list of Lenten resolutions. She's got a plan for the next 40 days and she's ready to be transformed.

Good Friday Me is tired. She's lumbering into church dragging six weeks of failure and unfulfilled expectations behind her. Nothing went the way it was supposed to (again). She didn't accomplish what she wanted (again) and she doesn't want to dwell on it (again).

If Satan offered both versions of myself the same deal he offered Christ — submit to me, and you will have the whole world — I have to wonder: which one of these creatures, formed and fallen, would be strong enough to defy him? Would either?

I can't say that the chipper, optimistic woman on Ash Wednesday has more strength than the tired woman on Good Friday. To each of these women Satan offers an easy way out. But to each, too, Christ offers an abundance of grace and the gift of justification.

This Lent, I know that I will be tested. I know that I will fail in many ways. I know that my intentions and my best efforts will not be enough.

But I bring them to the altar anyway, and I leave them there as an offering. And I know that Easter morning will dawn, and the tomb will be empty.

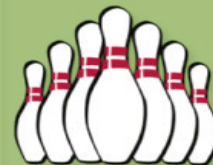

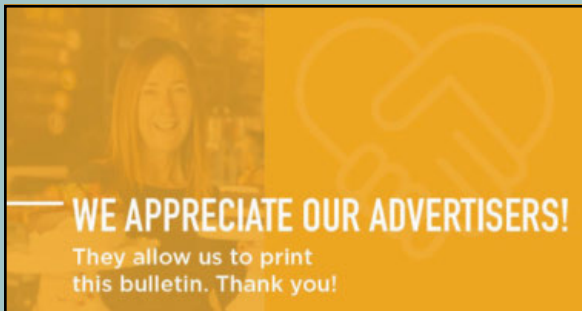
