

Scandal, division, disease, doubt. The Church has withstood each of these




throughout our very human history. But today we confront all of them, all at once.

Before Mass?

If you were to read Canon 919 of the Church's governing Code of Canon Law, it says that "one who is to receive the most holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion."

All of us realize there is no official rule book detailing what is food and what is not, so we should really simply use our heads as God and the Church expect us to do in a lot of things.

Some people believe that if gum is sugar-free, it doesn't break the fast since it has no nutritional value. Let's be fair! Reasoning like that is pretty silly, artificial and the height of casuistry! What we need to do is look at the reason for the rule and seek to apply it.

We all know that the Eucharist is holy, nourishing not our bodies for a day but our souls for eternity. To remind us of just how special this Sacred Bread is, the Church requires that no other food enter our mouths for an hour before receiving it, so as not to mix the profane with what is sacred. So actually, it makes no difference if gum is sugar-free or not, or whether you chew it or swallow it. It all makes the mouth less worthy as a receptor for the Body of Christ. So, yes, gum is food and Catholics shouldn't be chewing it the hour before they receive Communion. Should you see someone chewing gum in church, teach them what you just read, and then tell them to stick it under the pew like everyone else does before Father Joe sees!

Guidelines For Receiving Communion

On the inside back cover of our missalettes, parishioners and visitors will find guidelines for receiving Holy Communion in the Catholic Church. Catholics, for example, must be free from mortal sin and fast for one hour before ever receiving the Holy Eucharist. Should a serious sin have been committed, then



sacramental confession is required before Catholics receive Communion.

And while we are always happy to welcome our brothers and sisters from other denominations to St. Peter's, let's not forget that the Church has always believed and taught that partaking of the Eucharist signifies a special unity among us. Unfortunately, the sad reality is that Catholics and Protestants are not one in faith, life or worship. We share a common baptism, but there are differences between us and the most important one is that Catholics believe the Eucharist is God. Our Protestant brothers and sisters do not, and therefore should refrain from receiving Communion at Mass. If you have questions, please call either Pope Francis or Bishop Malloy. If you are unable to reach them, you should call Msgr. Joe at the parish office.
