Grace and rich blessings are given to those who regularly adore Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. We invite you to spend time praying before the monstrance every weekend, anytime between 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays until 6:45 a.m. on Sundays

Why is Exposition of the Eucharist Necessary?

The difference between spending time with Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament exposed in a monstrance, rather than in the tabernacle, is the same as the difference between conversing with a friend face to face instead of through a closed door. Most adorers say that seeing our Lord under the appearance of the Sacred Host is much more conducive to intimacy than Him being hidden in a tabernacle. It also helps adorers to be faithful to their scheduled hour, because they know that Jesus cannot be left alone in the Most Blessed Sacrament exposed in a monstrance.

Adorers are guardians of the Most Blessed Sacrament, so their presence is necessary. Yet, the most compelling reason for exposition is because the Holy Spirit asks for it. During His discourse on the Bread of Life, Our Lord made this unmistakably clear:

"Indeed, this is the will of My Heavenly Father, that everyone who looks upon the Son and believes in Him, shall have eternal life. Him I will raise up on the last day." Jn 6:40

What are the Benefits?

When a person spends time in the presence of Our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament, they grow in holiness. Communally, Mass attendance will increase and conversions happen. The return of fallen away Catholics and more vocations to the priesthood and religious life are among the fruits of adoration. Through our Holy Hours of prayer, Pope Francis said that we are contributing to "the radical transformation of the world," the "establishing of everlasting peace," and the coming of Christ's Kingdom on earth."

Is this the Mission of the Laity?

Yes! The Second Vatican Council emphasized the importance of lay involvement in the mission of the Church. Adoration is coordinated by the laity, in cooperation with clergy.

The Apostles' Creed series - part 1 (of 5)

Over the next five weeks, this series will break down the 12 articles of the Apostles Creed, the essentials of our faith. (Source material excerpted from CatholicWorldMission.org, contributed by Rev. John Trigilio, Jr. and Rev. Kenneth Brighenti.)

The Apostles' Creed has strong ties to the Apostles' beliefs and teachings and is attributed to some of the earliest missionary followers of Jesus, distilling the fundamental basics of what it means to be a Christian and follow in the teachings of God. The creed acts as a concise summary of His teachings and is deeply rooted in Scripture. It was created in response to heresy, defending the Christian faith and Gospel and to help articulate the foundational aspects of the Catholic faith against heresy.

Article 1: I Believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth.

The first article of the Apostles' Creed affirms the existence of God and begins to declare that God is a triune God, meaning he is one God but in three persons known as the Holy Trinity. The Holy Trinity is made of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The first article also states that God created everything within our universe.

Article 2: And in Jesus Christ, His Only Son, Our Lord.

The second article reaffirms that Jesus is God's son and that He is divine. The term "Lord" itself implies divinity as it is ascribed to God, so using the word "Lord" in reference to Jesus directly relates the Son to divinity.


