


Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord is a luminous example of this.

Knights of Columbus Sponsored Silver Rose Prayer Service Friday, August 18 at 8:00 am

A Silver Rose on a nine-month pilgrimage will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at St. Peter's Church in Spring Grove on August 18 at 8:00 a.m. in the Church proper. This program is sponsored by the Knights of Columbus Council #12302 in Spring Grove to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and to express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life.

The journey of the Silver Rose begins each year in March and ends on December 12, on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico. The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose—a real, live one—was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the



Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a Silver Rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight Silver Roses travel unique routes. In 2001, when Carl Anderson, Past Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, expanded the Silver Rose Program, he commented: "Through [the Silver Rose Program] we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the [Knights of Columbus], but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

Share the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe and promote respect for life by participating in this meaningful pilgrimage. The Silver Rose Program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady. Each year, from early March through mid -December, Silver Roses are stewarded by Knights of Columbus councils along routes from Canada to Mexico. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for Respect for Life, for the spiritual renewal of each nation, and for the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Join us as we pray all four mysteries of the rosary, every Wednesday evening starting at 6 o'clock.

Blessed rosaries can be found hanging on the wall, just to the left of the statue of our Blessed Mother.

Take one as a FREE gift from our Knights of Columbus.

Pray it daily, and it becomes a weapon in spiritual warfare.

The Apostles' Creed series - part 2 (of 5)

This five-week series breaks down the 12 articles of the Apostles Creed, the essential of our faith.

The early Church was designed to spread the glory of God and the apostolic faith that was shared from Jesus' teachings and His disciples. Baptismal candidates would memorize these and practice their teachings.

Article 3: Who was Conceived by the Power of the Holy Spirit and Born of the Virgin Mary.

This article affirms that Jesus has human nature in the sense that He was born of a human mother, the Virgin Mary. At the same time, Jesus also has divine nature because He was born of the Holy Spirit and not a human father. Jesus Christ is considered both man and God, fully divine and fully human.

Article 4: He Suffered Under Pontius Pilate, Was Crucified, Died and Was Buried.

Jesus was both divine and human, meaning He felt pain and could die, which He did on Good Friday. It was under Pontius Pilate that Jesus was crucified and killed. The mention of Pontius Pilate, by name, places the crucifixion within human history. Pilate was an actual human person, appointed by Caesar to be the Roman Governor of Judea. This puts the life and death of Jesus within a chronological and historical context. It also reminds us that one can't blame the death of Jesus on all Jews, as some have erroneously done over the ages. While certain religious leaders conspired against Jesus, the actual death sentence was given by a Roman and carried out by Roman soldiers.




