


### God Bless Our Women's Ministry!

For many centuries, the Rosary has been an integral part of our Catholic identity and a path to holiness! Our Blessed Lady introduced the Rosary to St. Dominic in 1208, and one of his followers, a man named Alan de la Roche, founded the first Confraternity of the Rosary in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. It continued to develop over the centuries and the latest development happened in 2002, when St. John Paul II added the Mysteries of Light. Clearly, it's a devotion proven by the test of time!

The Rosary is powerful because the repetition of prayers assists our minds to focus and meditate on the life of Christ and the mysteries of our beautiful faith. Without a doubt, it is the greatest of all sacramentals and you would have a hard time finding a saint after the 13<sup>th</sup> century, that did not have a devotion to the Most Holy Rosary!

Praying the Rosary has been a marker of Catholic identity for centuries, and devotion to our Mother Mary is intimately tied with being Catholic.

Here at St. Peter's, we have many opportunities to pray the Rosary publicly together. It is prayed 30 minutes before every weekday Mass, as well as before the 4:00 p.m. Mass on Saturdays. Then, every Wednesday, beginning at 6 o'clock, we have another opportunity to pray all four mysteries of the Holy Rosary with our pastor. And don't forget the Public Square Rosary Rally on October 14<sup>th</sup>, beginning at 2:30 p.m. at the Shrine of our Lady of Fatima! Best of all, Father Joe is encouraging our parish families to pray a daily rosary together, particularly during the month of October.

If you are new to the Rosary, or if you want to grow deeper in your devotion, please call Father Joe and he will be happy and honored to teach you and share thoughts about his own devotion to Mary. Just don't deny yourself or loved ones this powerful weapon! *Pray the rosary with confidence and the results will amaze you!* 

#### MISSIONARY CO-OP IS NEXT WEEKEND!



Every year, during Fall, our parish participates in the Missionary Cooperation Plan. Next weekend we will be welcoming Fr. Richard Migodela, OSB! Fr. Richard is a Benedictine priest and he is coming to represent the Community of African

Benedictine Sisters of Our Lady Help of Christians. The needs of their community in Tanzania are many, but the biggest challenge they face is providing the basic human needs of 100 vulnerable street children who are under their care at an elementary school, which they established for these children. What St. Peter's Parish gives next weekend is vital if they are to continue supporting the children's education, as well as feeding and sheltering them and treating medical issues.

Father Richard is aware that we have no second collections at St. Peter's, but that we will be honored to share 50% of our weekend offertory with the African Benedictine Sisters of Our Lady Help of Christians. #### The Vineyard

The second son never showed up to the vineyard. Did he get lost? Did he get tired? Did he not know where to begin?

When it comes right down to it, good intentions amount to very little. We all know this, don't we? "Show me, don't tell me." "I'll believe it when I see it." It's as true in the workplace and in relationships as it is in the life of the Christian disciple.

It doesn't matter if we *intend* to work in the vineyard. It doesn't matter if we promise to, if we think about it a lot, or if we make grand plans for what we will accomplish there. None of that matters if we don't show up. Before we show up, we have to find the way.

Showing up is the whole point. The work is the point, not the intention.

But all this begs the question: what does the work mean for us as baptized Catholics in the modern world? Spending our Saturdays in soup kitchens and homeless shelters? Standing on a street corner shouting out the words of the Gospel?

Our baptismal call is to the vineyard. Where is our vineyard? How do we show up? We are ready, Lord, we say. We intend to work. But where do we go?

My vineyard is not your vineyard, and so it's not my place to tell you how to get there. I am glad you want to go, but you'll have to find your own way, just like I will. But I can tell you this: only one voice will lead you there. If you listen to it, you will find your vineyard.


