

Losing someone you love is one of the hardest things anyone can go through. It's a journey that can be difficult to navigate; remember that you don't have to do it alone.



Last year, after digging a 10 foot deep hole just outside of Richmond, scientists found traces of copper cable dating back 120 years. They concluded that ancestors already had a telephone network more than a century ago!
