

What are the Corporal Works of Mercy?

As followers of Christ, we're encouraged to care for each other. Jesus' parable of the judgment of the sheep and the goats (Matthew 25:31-46) list the ways we can care for those in physical need: "For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me..." (Matthew 25:35).

These are the Corporal Works of Mercy: to feed the hungry and give drink to the thirsty, to clothe the naked, to visit the sick and imprisoned, to shelter the homeless and to bury the dead. Essentially, "it is by what they have done for the poor that Jesus Christ will recognize His chosen ones" (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2443).

The Corporal Works of Mercy are about being aware of others' needs and responding to them. Living the Corporal Works of Mercy is how we can make our love for God and others visible and effective. "Whatever you did for one of these... you did for Me" (Matthew 25: 40).

On the Cover

"The Sower" by Vincent Van Gogh

Van Gogh had a special interest in sowers throughout his artistic career. All in all, he made more than 30 drawings and paintings on this theme. He painted this Sower in the Autumn of 1888. At the time, Van Gogh was working together with Paul Gauguin (1848-1903). Gauguin believed that in his work Van Gogh should draw less on reality and more on his imagination. His painting, which later became aptly known as The Sower, 1888, where the sun in the horizon, becomes a huge, godlike, bright disk flooding the sky with light. The effect is so strong that colors are inverted and stark complementary color appear: the sky is painted with yellow and greenish hues and the land with violet.

While Van Gogh lived in an asylum for the mentally ill in Saint Remy, France, he painted similar pictures that later became known as "Wheatfield with a Reaper." Van Gogh's paintings, often portrayed celestial bodies such as the sun, moon or stars, even turbulent galaxies.

Here, Van Gogh used colors meant to express emotion and passion. The bright yellow sun looks like a halo, turning The Sower into a Saint.




