


Annual Diaper Drive April 13th & 14th


Both Carol and Ron were faithful Catholics who believed that Jesus is victorious over death, and He is the

Ever since our bishops lifted the dispensation from our Sunday obligation to attend Mass, many parishioners have commented that the number of people coming to Church, hasn't improved all that much. Father Joe could see it, too, but remained hopeful that parishioners would return to praying the Mass, just as they had done prior to the pandemic. Enough time has passed and unfortunately, the number of empty pews do not justify having three Sunday Masses.

The situation is further complicated because our attempts to recruit new Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, Ushers and Altar Servers has not been as successful as we hoped. Granted, we did attract some new volunteers and we are most grateful to them, but without reducing the number of Masses, we would still be overburdening the ministers we currently have.

There is yet another reason for making this change. We have been so fortunate to have weekend assistance from priests who are furthering their studies at the Seminary in Mundelein. However, indications are that clergy are now opting to achieve their advanced degrees by taking online courses and remaining in their home dioceses.

Change is always difficult, and Father Joe is asking for our understanding when we begin having two Sunday Masses, starting the first weekend in June. **The 8:00 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. Masses would be appealing to most people and the least disruptive to our weekend routines.** Confessions and the 4:00 p.m. Saturday Mass will remain the same.

Should a time come when parishioners return to keeping every Sunday holy and every pew is filled and people are standing in the aisles, Father Joe will be very glad to add more Masses.

Let's pray that that day will come.

Written in the Wounds

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eyes, eyes given to him by God, eyes which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.



On the Cover ~ "Divine Mercy"

Eugene Kazimierowski was the artist who painted the first Image of Divine Mercy which currently hangs in the Shrine of Divine Mercy in Vilnius, Lithuania.

He was born on November 11, 1873. He was a Polish Realistic painter and he preferred to paint landscapes and portraits. But it was his painting the first Divine Mercy Image in 1934 for which he is best known. He was commissioned to paint this holy Image by St. Faustina's spiritual director and confessor Blessed Fr. Michael Sopocko.

Mr. Kazimierowski was a student at the Kraków Academy of Fine Arts from 1892–1897. He continued his studies in Munich, Paris, and later Rome. After World War I ended, he resettled to Vilnius. There he taught at the Vilnius Teacher Seminary and decorated theatres throughout Vilnius.

The painting of Divine Mercy was first displayed in public during the Easter ceremonies on April 25–28, 1934. The first Mass with a Divine Mercy Image was celebrated by Blessed Fr. Michael Sopocko at the Gate of Dawn Church in Vilnius, on April 28, 1935, which has now become known as the Feast of Mercy. St. Faustina records in her Diary that many people present on that day were very curious as to where this new Image of Jesus had come from, but St. Faustina could not tell them. Shortly after this time, the Mother Superior and St. Faustina had prayer cards with the Image printed on one side printed and distributed them in Vilnius.

Mr. Kazimierowski died in 1939 and although most of his paintings were destroyed during World War II, his painting of the Divine Mercy Image was never harmed.
