## **A Renovation Update**

- 1) Our artists, Nadiya and Vera, have been working 12 hour days, repairing damage in the stairwell and choir loft. Once they finish painting the loft, they will begin working in the vestibule, which shouldn't take long at all. The Stations of the Cross have been refreshed and look incredible, and they will be rehung before Lent begins. We estimate only 4-5 more weeks to finish all the painting!
- 2) We were informed that new lights will be shipped on March 3<sup>rd</sup> and installation will begin as soon as they are delivered! We showed you pictures, in past bulletins, and we received many compliments from parishioners. You're going to love them!
- 3) Fr. Joe and a team of parishioners also met with designers and installers from Kenny's Carpet in Richmond, and Bella Tile and Stone in Lake Geneva. A beautiful tile was chosen for the main aisle, as well as the front of our church, just below the steps. The tiles are an off-white and compliment the colors of the walls. The middle of the main aisle will be adorned with a large, circular mosaic with the keys of St. Peter and an upside down cross on which our patron was martyred.

  The front of the sanctuary, (where the altar and ambo are) will be carpeted, as will be the side aisles and beneath the pews. We are considering everything we can so as not to interfere with the quality of our sound system. In the meantime, Kenny's Carpet & Flooring is putting together samples and designs for our consideration.
- 4) New window shades were ordered and have arrived, and will be installed soon!

  That is the latest update, dear friends, and we hope that everyone is pleased with the progress we have made! God is so good and there is so much for which we are grateful!

## Do You Know Why the Church Calls Mary the Ark of the New Covenant?

She is the Ark of the New Covenant because of Who she held within her womb. Sacred Scripture teaches that the Ark of the old covenant held three things: 1) It contained the Word of God in Stone, 2) the rod of Aaron, our ancestral priest, and 3) it contained manna, which was bread sent down by God from heaven to feed the Israelites.

Similarly, our Blessed Mother holds within her womb: 1) the Word of God in the flesh, Jesus Christ, 2) The high Priest, Jesus Christ and 3) The Bread of Life, Jesus Christ.

That is why Mary is the Ark of the New Covenant! Lets' know our faith.

### "I Choose Heaven!"

Our time on Earth is but a fleeting moment compared to the vastness of eternity. Yet, we often prioritize earthly concerns over preparing for Heaven. Jesus reminds us of the right priority: "Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be given to you besides" (Matthew 6:33). When we put God first, He faithfully provides for our every need.

#### What are your true priorities?

Your daily routine is a reflection of your heart. Pause and consider: What consumes your time and energy? The things that dominate your schedule are the true indicators of your priorities. If they are pulling you away from God, it's time to reevaluate and make a change.

#### Where do you turn for guidance?

When faced with decisions, do you seek advice from friends, social media, or colleagues, or do you turn to prayer and Scripture? Aligning our choices with God's wisdom leads to lasting fulfillment and peace. Resolve to trust His direction over the fleeting opinions of the world. When we place our decisions in His hands, we can move forward with confidence.

### Do you trust God with your happiness?

God's promises assure us of His perfect plan: "For I know well the plans I have in mind for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare, not for woe, plans to give you a future full of hope" (Jeremiah 29: 11). If trusting Him feels difficult, invite Him into your doubts and fears. Ask Him to reveal His goodness and faithfulness—He will answer, because He is always near.

Refocus your heart and trust God's plan for your life. Let go of distractions, realign your priorities, and step into the peace that comes from seeking Him first.

## (Practicing) Catholic The Catch

Mini Reflection: What does it mean to lower your net? It means to listen to God, even when you don't understand Him. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you.

#### The Catch

I love today's Gospel passage, and not just because I love a good fish fry.

I love it because I am Peter. Over and over again, I am Peter, standing here exhausted because I relied on my own abilities, and it got me nowhere. I'm ready to call it quits. I'm ready to say it's too hard. And here comes Jesus, asking me to lower my net. To keep trying.

And I try to talk sense into him. "It's not going to work, God," I insist. "I've been trying."

"You've been trying," Jesus agrees. "But you haven't asked for my help yet."

What does it mean to lower your net? It sounds so simple and so easy, but it takes a great deal of humility and trust. I think I'm the expert on my own life, the captain of my own ship. Peter probably thought so, too—he was the fisherman, after all. Why would a fisherman listen to a carpenter on matters of fishing?

Lowering your net means giving God control and letting yourself be changed by what He chooses to show you.

It means to listen to God's instructions, even when you don't understand them, even when you find them frustrating. It means to keep trying the hard thing that you know is the right thing, even when it hasn't born much fruit. It means to keep loving the person who is making life hard on you, even when all you want to do is give into feelings of bitterness and distrust.

If we would only lower our nets, the catch would astound us.
