Due to a scheduling error, there will be NO Lenten Soup & Salad Supper on Friday, March 21st.


We regret the mistake and still hope everyone will come to the Stations of the Cross beginning at 7:00 pm.

(Practicing) Catholic

Mini Reflection: It's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust when we're facing a situation that confuses or alarms us. But we all have a divine confidante that can help us sort through anything we're dealing with. Are we taking advantage of that?

The Divine Confidante

My husband pretty much knows that if he tells me something—anything—he's also telling my sister.

Most of us have that person that we run to when we have important information. I'm not even talking about gossip; I'm talking about stuff we just have to discuss. We joke that I don't really know how I feel about something until I've run it by my sister first.

There's not really anything wrong with that. When we're trying to figure out how to think about something that has happened or how to react to a certain situation, it's always helpful to get the opinion of someone we trust.

But what if we ran as quickly to discuss the situation with God as we did to discuss it with our "person?" Wouldn't that be ideal?

After witnessing the transfiguration—an event that had to have been as confusing as it was astounding—we hear that the disciples "fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone what they had seen."


When something profound, frightening, or confusing happens, our first confidente should be God. I'm reminded of Luke 2:19: "Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart." There is something to be said for taking a moment to keep that information sacred between ourselves and the One who can really help us confront it.

Sure, maybe we don't understand what just happened. Maybe we're scared by it. We don't really know how we feel about it. And that's totally okay. The divine confidente knows how to help us pray through that confusion, that fear.

If you're someone's "person" and they come to you wanting to talk, that's great. Talk it out. But remind them—and remind yourself—to pray about it as much as you talk about it.

Let the love of those things carry you through this Lent, and beyond.

As we begin preparing for the You Will Be My Witnesses Campaign, the diocese wants to use this time to answer all inquiries from parishioners across northern Illinois, as well as concerns that frequently arise from campaigns of this magnitude.

What is the current financial status of our diocese?

The Diocese of Rockford is in healthy financial condition. This capital campaign will allow us to fund new ideas, new possibilities, and new growth in our diocese and parishes. As a result, our hope is that this campaign will help increase Mass attendance, foster healthier and stronger Catholic families, give rise to greater Catholic witness in our communities and grow ministry participation for years to come.

What happens if we exceed our goal?

Should we exceed our \$60 million goal, the additional diocesan funds will be allocated to the following priorities:

+ Diocesan Facilities Fund

The people of the diocese deserve and should expect that the facilities of our diocese are welcoming and well-maintained. These funds will be used to maintain and improve facilities of and throughout the diocese and to establish an endowment for future needs.

+ Diocesan Communications

Funds will be used to assess and support diocesan offices, churches and schools in identifying communication needs and resources. This will involve leveraging modern technology and addressing the media needs of parishioners effectively.

+ Bishop's Charitable Fund

Bishop Malloy frequently receives requests for financial aid by missionaries, Catholic non-profits and bishops from under-developed areas of the United States and countries around the world, as well as local needs and charities. The funds held in this fund will allow him to share from the goodness and generosity of people of the diocese.

WHY DO CATHOLICS GIVE SOMETHING UP FOR LENT

Catholics around the world make sacrifices during Lent to remind us that God is greater than anything the world can offer. By giving up small comforts or practicing acts of self-denial, we acknowledge that every good gift comes from Him. The sacrifice serves to remind us.

True love requires sacrifice
God demonstrated this perfectly by giving
His only Son for our salvation (John 3:16).
Our Lenten sacrifices help us imitate this
divine love. By uniting our sacrifices with
Christ's ultimate sacrifice on the Cross, we
become more like Him.

Cultivate a Heart for Lent

Just as an experienced gardener prepares the soil before planting to ensure healthy growth, we must prepare the "soil" of our hearts during Lent. This season invites us to clear away obstacles that hinder our relationship with God and nourish our spirits through prayer and the Sacraments. By doing so, we cultivate the "good fruits" that lead to a renewed and vibrant spiritual life.

Uproot the Weeds: Studies suggest that forming a new habit takes at least three weeks, depending on its nature. Begin by uprooting unhealthy habits and replacing them with holy, life-giving practices. Start small but be consistent—like waking up just five or ten minutes earlier to pray. Even small acts of self-discipline build the spiritual strength needed to face greater challenges, including temptations.

Nourish the Soil: Spiritual growth isn't possible without grace. Mother Teresa, despite her incredible work, insisted on a daily Holy Hour, affirming, "How can we last even one day living our life without hearing Jesus say, 'I love you' – impossible." Follow her example by creating and following a routine of daily prayer, weekly Mass, and monthly Confession.

Preserve the Fruits: Commit to practices that bring new life, like choosing kindness over gossip, and prayer over screen time. By nurturing these habits, you'll encounter Jesus' love more deeply and reflect that love to others.

As we journey through Lent, may our hearts become fertile ground where faith, hope, and love can blossom abundantly.


