We pray a Rosary for Spiritual Warfare, every Wednesday at 6:00 p.m. in the church, and you can also join us for a simple supper of Soup and Salad at 6:00 p.m.



on Fridays. Afterward, pray the Stations of the Cross, with our pastor, beginning at 7:00 in the church. But Father Joe also encourages us to participate in one hour of Eucharistic Adoration between 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays and 7:45 a.m. on Sunday. An hour of quiet Scripture reading and reflection, in a beautiful setting, just absorbing the beauty of the Real Presence of Christ, will be the best 60 minutes of your week!

The church feels welcoming with lit candles and soft lighting on the Monstrance with Our Lord. Feel the peace of His presence in the quietness of our church. Nothing will be demanded of you, and you don't have to think about anything in particular! It is another opportunity to have an intimate and silent conversation with Jesus every Saturday night. Yes, the quietness of gazing on His love and being gazed back by Him will bring a "peace that surpasses all understanding." If you would like more information, call Fr. Why not use this Lent to get closer to Christ by studying the Gospel of St Luke? The Gospel of Luke Bible Study begins again on April 1st at 9:00 a.m. (no joke), and April 2nd at 6:30 p.m. Studies will continue each Tuesday morning or Wednesday evening through April 29th - 30th. Whether you are returning from the last study or registering as a new participant and need study materials, call Laura in the Parish Office at 815-675-2288. Your fee is only \$25 because St. Peter's is covering 50% of the cost!


We are starting softball again in April and are looking for players who would like to come out and have some fun with fellow parishioners and share fellowship with neighboring churches.


