You Are Not Alone

"My sheep hear My voice; I know them, and they follow Me." — John 10:27

Life is filled with stress, challenges, and times of great trouble. From school finals to health battles to major transitions, the weight of these moments can feel overwhelming. Yet today's readings remind us of a deeper truth: We are never abandoned. In Revelation, John sees a



vision of the saints who have "survived the time of great distress." Their survival isn't just physical—it's spiritual. They remain in God's hands, held by His love and strengthened by His presence.

Stress has the power to reveal, clarify, and purify. It shows us what we truly value, in whom we trust, and it refines our hearts for God. Like the disciples in Acts who faced persecution with joy, we are called to interpret stress through the lens of faith. Jesus assures us, "No one can take them out of My hand" (John 10:28). Even in difficulty, we belong to Him.

Whatever you're facing today—trials, uncertainty, or grief—remember: You are not abandoned, you are not alone, and you do not have to be afraid. Trust in the Lord's presence, and keep moving forward, knowing that nothing given to God is ever wasted.

Why Do We Do That? Catholic Life Explained

Question:

I can't explain it. I feel a nudge from God to something out of the ordinary. How do I respond?

Answer:

You're in good company! Abraham was asked to leave all he knew and loved for a strange land, with only abstract divine assurance that such a sacrifice would be worth it. Plenty of prophets protested against God's call, whether it was claiming they were too young (Jeremiah) or running away entirely, only to end up in a whale's belly (Jonah). St. Joseph was asked to do something very strange.



(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC We Don't Follow Strangers

Mini Reflection: I don't have all the answers to the questions I would love to ask Christ. "Why is this happening? Where are you taking me? What comes next?" But the beautiful thing is, I don't actually need those answers. I know him. He's got my hand. Wherever we're going is where I want to be.

We Don't Follow Strangers

I get a little crazy when it comes to my kids' safety. We've probably had a few too many conversations that could be entitled "What to Do If Mommy Loses You At the State Fair" or "Don't Trust People Just Because They Smile At You." Am I making them paranoid? Possibly. But that's something they can sort out later with their therapists.

Because here's the bottom line of it all—I don't want to instill a fear of strangers into my kids, but I do want them to understand that you can't always trust people you don't know (heck, you can't always trust the people you do know, but that's another therapy-provoking conversation we can have when they're older).

If someone says, "Hey, follow me," and we don't know them, it's not always a great idea to comply. First, we have to ask questions. "Where are you taking me? Why are we going? Who else will be there?"

But if someone we know and love and trust says, "Hey, follow me," we don't even think twice, and we don't need to ask any questions. We know wherever we're going is a safe place for us because we have a relationship with the person doing the leading. We feel comfortable putting ourselves in their care.

That's why it's so important to Christ that we know him. That we have a relationship with him. That we trust him.

Because we don't follow strangers, do we?

I don't have all the answers to the questions I would love to ask Christ. "Why is this happening? Where are you taking me?" But the beautiful thing is, I don't actually need those answers. I know him. He's got my hand. Wherever we're going is where I want to be.

How Can I Make a Consecration to Mary?

The Marian Consecration, or Total Consecration to Mary, is a devotion dating back to the 1700's introduced by St. Louis de Montfort. It involves entrusting one's life to Jesus through the Blessed Mother. This practice has been highly praised by many saints and popes, including Pope St. John Paul II.

Marian consecration does not involve worshipping Mary or treating her as divine. Instead, it acknowledges that Mary, as Christ's mother, always leads us to her Son. Mary serves as a bridge, guiding us closer to Jesus by the safest and most direct route.

On the Cross, Jesus gave His mother to humanity, saying, "Behold your mother" (John 19:26-27). St. John Paul II saw this as an invitation to deeper intimacy with Christ by drawing closer to the one closest to Him on earth.

Many who practice the consecration experience a deeper, more transformative prayer life, drawing closer to both Mary and Jesus.


