


Women's Ministry Announcements

Live the Liturgy **Inspiration of the Week**

"Whoever loves me will keep My word," Jesus tells His disciples, "and my Father... will come to Him and make our dwelling with Him." We know what's at stake. We know what we have to do. So when the Father comes, will He make His dwelling with us?

You are a Passion of Christ

Want to know someone? Find out what he or she loves. So what is Jesus passionate about? It's simple – He is passionate about you.

Not humanity in general, but you.

When Jesus looked at the crowds, He didn't see a blur of faces. He saw each person—knew them, loved them. The Crucifix and the Eucharist aren't just symbols; they're proof that His love goes to staggering lengths to be with us and bless us. It's a love so personal and intense, it demands a response. So how do we respond?

Start Simple: "Thank you. I love you." We assume people know we love them, but it still matters to say it out loud. The same is true of Jesus. In His appearances to St. Margaret Mary and later to St. Faustina, He shared how deeply wounded He is by indifference and ingratitude, especially in the Eucharist. He also promised immense grace to those who console Him with love, thanks and attention.

Come to the Feast: At every Mass, Jesus gives everything—His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1374) He gives us His whole Heart, hoping we'll give ours in return.

"As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in My love" (John 15:9).

He is present now as He was at the Last Supper. Simply showing up to be with Him is an act of love—and a bold act of faith.

Receive His Mercy: When we come to Him in Confession, genuinely sorry, He doesn't scold—He celebrates. Not because of our sin, but because He gets to pour out His mercy. "Souls that make an appeal to My mercy delight Me" (Diary of St. Faustina, 1146). Confession doesn't just free your soul—it fills His Heart with joy.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC Leaving the Room

Mini Reflection: What's so special about Pentecost that it wasn't until this moment—and not any of the equally world-changing moments that came in the weeks before it—that the Apostles became the Church?

Leaving the Room

I was a full-grown adult before I realized that Pentecost is known as "the birthday of the Church," and it only resonated with me because someone showed up to a church function with cake and candles. Leave it to buttercream frosting to drive home a theological reality I had been missing for 25 years.

I knew what Pentecost was, of course. It simply went over my head that, despite all the incredible, world-changing things that had come before the moment of Pentecost, prior to this day, the Apostles were just a group of guys in a room. It wasn't until Pentecost that they became the Church.

So what makes the Church...well, the Church, capital C? What makes it more than just a group of guys in a room?

It's true, they were a very special group of guys. They had the Truth—capital *T*. They had borne witness to Christ's miracles, to his life and to his passion and death.

But they were still in that room.

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they received graces and gifts that made them fit to carry out the Great Commission. The Truth wasn't enough, even with a capital *T*. They needed the Spirit—capital *S*—and more than that, they needed to receive it with the courage and faith necessary to do what was needed to be done.

To get up and leave the room.

Because what good is any of it unless they leave the room? What does it matter, the tongues of fire and the miraculous bilingualism and, frankly, the coming of the Spirit, if no one ever hears about it?

The mission is what made them the Church. It's what makes *us* the Church. Without it, we're just a bunch of guys in a room.






