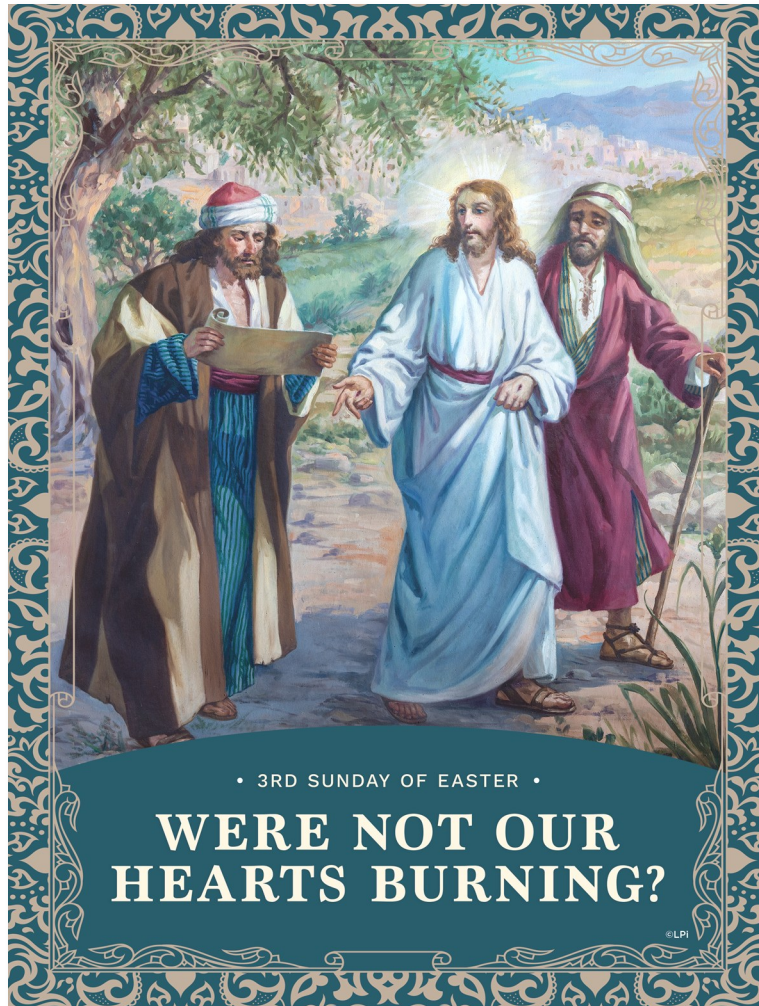

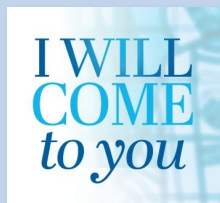

**Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,**

Next weekend every parish in our diocese will be asked to participate in the 2026 Diocesan Appeal. This campaign has an enormous impact on the ministries and programs that are offered at our parish and throughout the diocese.

## **To become an Extraordinary (Eucharistic) Minister, or a Eucharistic Minister to the Homebound**

is relatively easy to do — a few training sessions and approval of your name by the bishop — and it is an easy ministry to carry out, since you are at Mass anyway.

As you learn on your feet, you may feel a bit anxious about doing everything right, or if you are worthy enough, but when giving out Communion, you realize that this is it. This is why we are all here. Other Christians in other denominations study the Bible, believe in God, listen to homilies, run youth groups, perform acts of charity, try to serve others and to do God’s will, and we do all that too. But ***we come to Mass for the Eucharist.*** It’s what differentiates our faith from all others. Taking into ourselves the Real Presence of Jesus gives us an incredibly personal experience of Him, as He literally feeds us with Himself.

Being a Eucharistic Minister is both humbling and uplifting. Humbling because ***“Who am I to be giving out or bringing Communion to the homebound?”*** Uplifting because they receive Communion from your hands, you truly understand the blessing of why you are doing this. You feel the power of God working through you, His earthen vessel.

## DON'T JUST CELEBRATE EASTER STEP INTO IT.

*At the heart of Christianity is not just an idea or a rule of life, but an encounter with the Risen Christ and the new life of grace He offers. Easter invites us to step into that life more deliberately.*

*Here are four simple ways to begin:*

**Encounter the Risen Christ.** Mary Magdalene stood before Jesus and didn't recognize Him until He spoke her name (John 20:16), and her grief became joy. That encounter is possible for us. **Come to Mass with intention. Don't just attend—arrive expecting to meet Him.** Listen closely, pray honestly, and remember that in the Eucharist, Christ is truly present.

*Practical step: Before Mass, pray, "Jesus, help me recognize You today."*

**Take an "Emmaus Walk."** Two disciples left Jerusalem discouraged, and Jesus met them on the road. He helped them to see God's faithfulness in their lives. He can do the same for you. **Take time this Easter Season for a quiet walk with Him. Speak openly about what's on your heart, and listen for His voice.**

*Practical step: Ask, "Lord where have You been at work in my life that I haven't seen?"*

**Choose Mercy.** Jesus gave His Apostles the power to forgive sins (John 20:21-23), ensuring His mercy would always be available. We're called to receive it—and extend it. **Forgive, hold back harsh words, and choose patience.**

*Practical step: Identify one situation where you can offer a concrete act of mercy this week.*

**Be open to mission.** The Resurrection send us out. **God still calls ordinary people for His work.** Your mission may be simple: show patience, reach out, or step up where needed.

*Practical step: "Where am I being nudged to act?" Then take one small step.*

*Easter isn't just celebrated—it's lived, one step at a time.*

## (PRACTICING) CATHOLIC

RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

### THE STORY THAT NEVER ENDS

**Mini reflection:** Christ gave us everything. He gave us “happily ever after.” But what do you do with everything? What do you do with “happily ever after?” What do you do with the Resurrection? What do you do with salvation?

The biggest mistake we can make as Christians is to think that the Resurrection is the end of the story.

Of course we *know*, logically, that it isn’t—there are whole books of the Bible that come after it, detailing not just the activities and teachings of the Risen Christ, but the development of the early Church and the Gospel’s first baby steps into the wider world. We know this.

But sometimes we don’t act like it.

The thing is, we like stories that can be tied up neatly in a bow. It’s why “happily ever after” is a thing. These tidy endings are especially satisfying following an emotional gut punch and a twist—for instance, let’s say the crucifixion of the story’s hero and a *gotcha!* moment where it turns out he’s not dead after all. Drinks all around! And... scene. The curtain falls.

But the curtain didn’t fall. It still hasn’t.

Look at Cleopas. He has heard the testimony of people he knew, people he trusted—and yet, he’s in a world of confusion. He’s stumbling along the road, wondering what to believe.

Christ gave us “happily ever after.” But what do you do with “happily ever after?” What do you do with the Resurrection? What do you do with salvation?

The Resurrection left loose ends—not because it was insufficient, but because it was not a final chapter. So being a Christian means embracing the life of a loose end. It means figuring out what to do with the Resurrection, with salvation, with forgiveness—with this hard-won “happily ever after” that is a gift but also a commission.

Because the curtain is still up, and we are all characters in the Greatest Story Ever Told.

So, what’s the next scene?
